Joseph Lebovic (z"l) led a life of giving. Renowned in the GTA as a community builder and across the country as a compassionate and generous benefactor, Joseph will be remembered for his legendary contributions to health care, education and research.

For more than five decades, Joseph was an ardent supporter of Mount Sinai Hospital. Since 1983, he sat on the hospital's Board of Governors and on Sinai Health's Board of Directors since 2014. As a philanthropic ambassador of the hospital and former board member of Sinai Health Foundation, Joseph's spirit of giving reflected the values of care, compassion and community.

In 2006, Joseph and his brother Wolf made a transformational gift of \$50 million to Mount Sinai Hospital – the largest hospital donation in Canadian history at the time.

In recognition of their generosity, the hospital honoured the Lebovics in naming the Joseph and Wolf Lebovic Health Complex, which includes the Joseph and Wolf Lebovic Centre on Murray Street. The latter the Toronto Centre for Phenogenomics – a leading-edge science lab that continues to advance and redefine research globally.

Joseph's history-making gift also helped lay the groundwork for Renew Sinai, the largest and most ambitious redevelopment project in the hospital's history. "I really get so much pleasure from giving this money away," Joseph said at the time. "People should know giving doesn't hurt... It's a good investment."

"On behalf of everyone at Mount Sinai Hospital and Sinai Health, I extend my deepest condolences to the Lebovic family," said Peter F. Cohen, Chair, Board of Directors of Sinai Health. "Joe has been a true friend to us, and his vision to provide outstanding, compassionate care to every patient of Mount Sinai is a legacy that will live on for generations to come. His philanthropic leadership has been an inspiration to so many and has impacted countless lives in our community, and our country."

Joe Lebovic was a great supporter of many important causes throughout his life, and the Ontario Institute for Cancer Research (OICR) is grateful to have worked closely with him to develop the Joseph and Wolf Lebovic Fellowship Program, a joint initiative between the Hebrew University of Jerusalem's Institute for Medical Research Israel-Canada (IMRIC), Canadian Friends of Hebrew University and OICR. Through this program he supported research fellows working on collaborative, translational cancer research projects that brought together trainees in Ontario and Israel to solve significant challenges in cancer research. In its first round, this program supported the development of a new potential cancer-killing virus and a new drug candidate for leukemia; current fellows are working on projects focused on the interaction between tumours and the immune system, with a goal of developing effective therapeutic strategies for cancer. On behalf of all of OICR, I send my deepest condolences to Joe's family, friends and loved ones. His death is an immense loss to the entire province, but his vision and generosity will continue to have impact for many years to come.

"I want my donation to save lives," Joseph Lebovic said about his decision to support transplant research at UHN. His recent passing will be marked by the many people and organizations who were touched by his philanthropic spirit.

Along with his brother, Wolf, Joe Lebovic built a successful building and development company and became known for their charitable giving in support of health care, social services and community enrichment in the Greater Toronto Area.

UHN became a major beneficiary of Mr. Lebovic's philanthropy, having made donations in excess of \$8 million to support complex cancer surgery and organ transplant research. In 2013, Mr. Lebovic made a \$5-million donation in support of the Hepato-Pancreatico-Biliary Surgery Program at UHN. The donation was made to recognize the efforts of Dr. Steven Gallinger and his team who provide comprehensive care for patients with liver, pancreatic and/or biliary disorders – among the most challenging forms of cancer to treat. The Joseph and Wolf Lebovic Chair in Hepato-Pancreatico-Biliary Surgery, held by Dr. Gallinger, is helping to revolutionize treatments for liver and bile duct cancers, transforming the lives of patients and their families.

He was an active and engaged donor. After attending an event in support of the Ajmera Transplant Centre at UHN, he was deeply troubled when he learned that one in three people who need a transplant will die while they await a suitable donor organ. He also learned how UHN is often the place of last resort for people suffering from end-stage organ failure. He wanted to help transplant recipients live longer, fuller lives by pledging \$1 million to support the innovative work of Dr. Atul Humar, Medical Director of the Ajmera Transplant Centre, and his team.

As Mr. Lebovic became more involved in the Ajmera Transplant Centre's Live On fundraising campaign, he learned about the dramatic increase in kidney transplants as a result of chronic conditions such as diabetes, liver disease, hypertension and lupus. He was so impressed with the scope of research that he donated \$2 million to establish the Joseph and Wolf Lebovic Chair in Kidney Transplant Research. "I wanted to help the team expand the cadre of researchers trying to solve these problems," he explained.

UHN Foundation Board Member and Live On Transplant Campaign Board Champion George Eaton expressed that "Joe's desire to save lives will be his legacy to the many people awaiting organ transplants. His friendship, compassion and generosity will be deeply missed."

Weizmann Canada mourns the loss of dear friend and generous benefactor Joseph Lebovic Z"L, O.C., C.M., PHD, who passed away on May 1, 2021.

Joseph Lebovic was born in Czechoslovakia and is a Holocaust survivor from Hungary. Joe immigrated to Canada in 1949 with his father, a sawmill operator, and brother Wolf. In 1953 they established Lebovic Enterprises Ltd. — building homes, high rises, condominiums and industrial buildings.

Together, the Lebovic family has been a driver of economic growth and community development in Toronto and Ontario for over 60 years. Their commitment to the community includes monumental gifts supporting health care, education and research.

Among their many distinctions, in 2019, Joseph and Wolf were recognized with the nation's highest honour — being inducted as Members of the Order of Canada for their notable leadership and philanthropy.

Within the Weizmann community, Joseph and his brother Wolf generously supported vital projects in pursuit of excellence and creativity, including an innovative start-up in Biomedical Research and leading-edge exploration in Neuroscience and Climate Change.

Our community has lost a great visionary who will be missed by the entire Weizmann family - both here and in Israel. May his memory be a blessing.

# In Memory of Joseph Lebovic

The Anne Tanenbaum Center for Jewish Studies mourns the passing of Joseph ("Joe") Lebovic, our supporter, friend, and visionary. Thanks to his generosity, the Center created the "Joseph Lebovic Summer Experience in Jewish Studies;" which offered students the opportunity to participate in interdisciplinary and innovative courses, such as: "Tales of Violence: Life and Death of European Jewry," "Holocaust in Literature," and "Mizrahim in Israel: History, Politics, and Culture." Over the years, hundreds of undergraduate students have benefitted from the Lebovic Summer Program and went on to pursue Jewish Studies, in part, due to the rich and diverse learning experiences that they gained through these courses.

Born in Czhechoslovakia, Joe was in Budapest when the Nazis invaded Hungary. He spent some time in the Budapest ghetto, but was able to escape. In 1945, he and his father were able to escape Hungary altogether and ended up in London, where he attended Yeshiva and University of London. When in London, Joe studied economics and Jewish thought. In 1949, Joe, his brother Wolf, and their father immigrated to Canada. Eventually, the Lebovic family became one of the most significant players in Canada's economy – building affordable housing in Scarborough, developing other areas of real estate, transforming the Toronto community, and, of course, setting an example in philanthropy.

Every year, for the past 7 years, Joe came to meet students enrolled in our classes on history of the Holocaust. He generously shared with them his life story, answered their questions about how not to lose faith, how to start from nothing, how to keep an eye on the big picture, and even how to "see a good deal" when trying to build a career in real estate. He spent hours talking to students, both in groups and one on one – with no question off limits. Later, many wrote that they were not just inspired by Joe's resilience and his sense of humor, but above all, his kindness to them. Many of our students are first generation Canadians, and it was transformative for them to hear Joe's story and his encouragement to try new things, to develop expertise, and to excel at things that they do best. One student wrote that it was the first time he got to learn from a businessman of Joe's calibre, and also the first time he was able to take a photo with someone whose name is written on top of Mount Sinai Hospital Emergency wing, which he visited many times as a child.

Significantly, Joseph Lebovic served as an outspoken advocate for the academic study of Jewish history, culture, politics, and languages at the University of Toronto. His support of humanities in general, and Jewish studies in particular, in the era when universities and students increasingly lose faith in the field was crucial. The Centre, our students, and our community has been forever bettered by Joe's incredible vision and generosity.



From the staff and Board of Women's College Hospital Foundation and on behalf of our extended community, I would like to express my deep and sincere condolences to you and your family on his passing.

In addition to raising funds, this event allowed the Foundation to cultivate many new donor relationships, including one that led us to secure a seven-figure gift supporting a ground-breaking, anti human trafficking research initiative supported by the HART foundation led by Kelly Grier-Nadal. Without the generosity of Dr. Lebovic and yourself, this donation may not have otherwise been realized.

As Women's College Hospital continues to innovate, transform the healthcare landscape and work towards health equity for all, we remember and reflect on the courage and vision of our past supporters, especially those such as Dr. Joseph Lebovic.





Dear JNF Canada Leadership,

This past month has been a roller coaster of emotions. We commemorated Yom HaShoah, followed by Yom HaZikaron – Israel's National Memorial Day and then 24 hours later celebrated 73 years of Israel's independence with Yom Ha'Atzmaut. Israel was opening up as the vast majority of its adults were fully vaccinated. There was excitement and optimism in the air. Then on Lag B'Omer, Israel experienced its largest non-wartime tragedy with the death of 45 individuals, 2 of whom were Canadian, at Mt. Meron. We send our deepest condolences to those who passed away and our best wishes for a speedy recovery to those who were injured. It was incredible to see the true Israeli spirit as Arab communities set up refreshment and care stations for the emergency workers pouring into the northern region. Secular residents of Tel Aviv rushed to donate blood to help those who were injured, who happened to be mainly Haredi. Within the darkness of this national disaster, there was a glimmer of light in the manner in which diverse components of Israeli society pulled together. That is a source of comfort and inspiration.

Israel is an inspiring country. What we have achieved together over the past 73 years and beyond is simply a marvel. We played a part and continue to do so as we have a responsibility to be there for our extended family. There is still so much to accomplish and it will take many generations to achieve our goals of developing a country that is green, sustainable, secure, inclusive, supportive, etc. Our messaging and marketing are starting to work. People are beginning to understand that we are not just trees and water. We are trees and water and so much more. Our current ongoing projects include the Plugot Forest in the northern Negev, a rehabilitation of a seniors centre serving mainly Holocaust survivors in Rehovot, a playground at Kibbutz Nehemia in the Etzbah HaGalil, the Bervin JNF Canada House in Sderot as well as the Sderot Resilience Centre which is located nearby our animal-assisted therapy centre, an educational resource centre in Bnei Netzarim, a youth centre serving at-risk children in Jaffa, and the list goes on and on. You name the region and the segment of society, and more likely than not, JNF Canada is there making a difference. We must remember that although we specialize in building capital projects, we really specialize in transforming lives. We measure our success, not in square feet, or dunams, or any other geometric metric. Rather, our success is measured by the impact we have on the lives of Israel's citizens. We are so proud of our work and we hope you are as well.



We begin this update with a message about the passing of Joseph Lebovic. He was a member of our Board of Directors, served as a Negev Honouree, and he and his brother Wolf are the largest donors in JNF Canada's history. Joseph loved Israel as was evident from his countless contributions to the country and his numerous trips there. His last visit there was in November 2019 with JNF Canada as we inaugurated the Harper Centre in the Hula Valley. He will be buried in Israel near his sister. We can never properly thank him for his devotion and generosity to JNF Canada. We send our deepest condolences to the entire Lebovic family.
